What is Title I?

What is it?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Sequoyah Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, homelessness, or families in transition and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will place a copy of the plan in the front office and in the new enrollment packets. The plan will also be posted on the school website and parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.
